### Build Your Booth

### Meet Me At The Fair

You may have various invitations and opportunities to set up a Kairos booth at a church fair or gathering of some kind, but the question remains as to how you should actually go about it. The answer is really quite self-explanatory if you have ever been to one of these

craft fair type events. That is, the booths that consistently draw the most attention are those that seem to have something different to offer, something of real value to hand out, and a prize drawing of an unusual but attractive gift. Let's attack these options one at a time.

**1. Definitely use the prison angle to get attention.** — Signs that say “Help send me to prison.” or “Ask me about my time in prison,” etc. People are always attracted to that approach. Don't get too outlandish, but Kairos is after all a prison ministry!

**2. Hand out free “Kairos cookies” to all visitors.** — Or any freebie handout you think folks might come by for, but make it something that naturally leads to a conversation about Kairos. “So the reason we're handing out barbed wire today is ...” Okay, so some ideas are better than others, but you get the point.

**3. Prize drawing.** — These can be a little tricky in that you are probably working on a limited budget, but want everyone in attendance to give you their contact information for the drawing. A great place to start is someone you know who does artistic creations and might make a donation or give you a friend's discount. Think, “who do I know who sells something worthwhile? Or needs a little free advertising for their own product!”
