My friend Tony, a success story

I met Tony on Kairos #6, or #7 in 2000 or 2001 at the Torres Unit out near Hondo. (In case Tony should need protection for any reason, I will not use his sir name nor refer to any specific locations that could conceivably place him in jeopardy) I believe he was at my table but I can't remember for sure. At any rate, a short while later he wrote me what was to be the first of many letters over a period of about 6 or 7 years. Tony was not unlike so many of the fellows in prison, in that he grew up without a father at home. In these cases, when they establish a close relation with an adult male from the free world, it's almost natural that they see us as a father figure. It was this way with Tony. I explained to him, very carefully, that I didn't mind that he thought of me as a surrogate, or substitute father, but that our relationship would always be one in which Jesus Christ would stand between the two of us, that our relationship would always be Christ centered. I took a few repartitions, but he finally got it.

A couple of years before he was released, he asked me if I would come to Huntsville, to the Walls Unit, to pick him up and take him to his mother, and sister in central Texas. I agreed. When that time came Jeanne and I went there, not having any idea what we were to do. Thanks to help from a very kind individual, who knew a lot more than me, I managed to find Tony. We first went to the bank, and cashed his \$100.00 check. Next, we went to Wal-Mart where we put him in some new duds – head to foot. Then we hit the road. Stopping for lunch, Tony was so excited he couldn't eat, only 2 or 3 bits.

Arriving at our destination we went to the wrong place first, but with some help from a cousin we found our way to the mobile home park where mother and sister were busy preparing a big pot of menudo for his coming home celebration. The yard was full of cousins, mostly under the age of ten, and of course didn't recognize him as we approached them. Finally one of the older ones realized who he was and ran in the house to announce this arrival. Here came mother and sister wiping their hands on their aprons, and smiling from ear to ear. The three (mother, sister, and Tony) embraced in a fit of laughing, and crying. Then mother's body began to quake, and her legs started to fail her. We all grabbed for her, and in that very close encounter, the aroma of Cumino and Chili Powder was powerful. In a few moments, mother regained her composure. At that point, Jeanne backed away, and I retreated to our car. Then we just stood there and watched. It was a moment we shall never forget.

Some years ago Tony married Nora, and moved to the oil patch in West Texas where he has a responsible job with a firm that repairs pump jacks. He is faithful to the Catholic Church which is the faith of his upbringing. I am ever so proud of Tony, and pray God's blessing on he and his family.

4th. Qtr. Kairos State Board Meeting

Over 100 participants attended the recent Kairos of Texas Board meeting in Austin, Texas, October 16th. Here are summary highlights.

- **Guest Presentation:** At the request of KOT President Louis Esquivel, our UAC Chair Danny McQuay was invited to discuss the recent volunteer recruitment event in Fredericksburg and make his presentation briefing to the KOT community. Everyone enjoyed Danny's presentation and the recruiting event was touted as a model for other units.
- **Kairos of Texas (KOT) elections:** The Kairos of Texas community elected new officers for the coming year:
 - o **Chair:** *Bill Salser*
 - o **Vice Chair:** *Jim Irwin*
 - o **Treasurer:** *Robert Robinson*
 - o **Financial Secretary:** *Bob Cole*
 - o **Secretary:** *Tom Perdue*
 - o **I.C. Rep:** *John Kennell*
- **Volunteer prescription drug policy:** Volunteers who bring their own prescription drugs into a unit should bring the drugs in the original container with the Rx on the outside.
- **TDCJ on-line volunteer training:** TDCJ is offering on-line training for volunteers needing "refresher" training. Initial training, however, must be completed at a unit. Go to the TDCJ website. www.tdcj.state.tx.us
- **TDCJ volunteer handbook:** TDCJ has published a new edition of the volunteer handbook, which is available on the TDCJ website. www.tdcj.state.tx.us
- **Volunteer letters to inmates:** Kairos is asking volunteers to print the word "**volunteer**" after their name in the return address on letters to inmates. As additional reminders, do not use home addresses.
- **Parole chaplains:** TDCJ has established five regional chaplains to help parolees with transition to life on the outside.
- **Kairos of Texas website:** Check out the redesigned and updated KOT website www.kairostexas.org.
- **New Red manual:** Kairos International has published a new Red manual to replace the Blue manual we've been using for several years. Most changes are in Section IV. The KPMI website has a two-page summary of changes. www.kairosprisonministry.org
- **Food handler's course:** KOT suggests one member of the outside team complete the Texas Food handler's Course on line (cost \$10), then refresh other outside team members how to handle food safely. www.texasfoodhandler.com
